Each month we share information with our Team Members about various activities happening throughout the company. This month we wanted to share information with you that will help our Team Members understand just how important our industry is. CLS has been supporting businesses for over 126 years!!

Let's face it...we are in the laundry business. It doesn't seem that exciting, however, we are



vital to a variety of business operations. Without CLS, our customers would have to process their own linens, mats, uniforms, towels, etc. themselves. None of our customers have time for that!! They are focused on caring for patients at the doctor's office, serving food at their restaurants, teaching children math, and fixing cars at the dealership.

Rental and laundry services simplify things for businesses. We specialize in laundry, so we can manage the process much better than most businesses can on their own. Our services are convenient, highly scalable, sustainable, and cheaper than our customers trying to perform these same types of services in-house.

Here at CLS, each week our Team Members pick-up soil, sort, wash, process, package, and deliver nearly 1 million textile rental pieces!

Just to list a few products, we process weekly approximately:

- 77,000 aprons
- 450,000 bar/micro towels
- 15,000 table clothes
- 250,000 napkins
- 16,000 floor mats
- 35,000 garments



To our Production Team Members – while sorting soil, feeding napkins, or rolling mats, remember how important you are to ensure high quality.

Conveyors are vital for our operations, but can pose several hazards if not handled properly. Be aware of the following common hazards:

- **1.** Pinch Points: Where body parts or clothing can get caught between moving parts.
- 2. Nip Points: Areas where rotating parts meet and create a crushing hazard.

3. Caught-In/Between Hazards: Risks of getting trapped between the conveyor and other machinery or surfaces.

- 4. Falling Objects: Items that fall off conveyors can cause injuries.
- **5. Electrical Hazards:** Faulty wiring or improper use can lead to electrical shocks or fires.

Safety Practices to Follow

Awareness:

- Stay alert and aware of your surroundings when working near conveyors. **Guarding and Protection:**

- Always ensure guards and barriers around pinch points and nip points are in place.
- Never bypass or remove guards while the conveyor is in operation.
- It's crucial to never stand, walk, or sit on a conveyor belt. Conveyors are designed to transport materials, not people, and standing or walking on them poses a significant safety risk.

Emergency Stops:

- Familiarize yourself with the location and operation of emergency stop buttons.

- Use emergency stops only in urgent situations to prevent accidents.

Housekeeping:

- Keep the area around conveyors clean and free of debris.

- Report any loose parts or potential hazards to your supervisor immediately.

Lockout/Tagout Procedures:

- Follow lockout/tagout procedures strictly during maintenance and repairs.
- Only trained and authorized personnel should perform lockout/tagout.

Regular Maintenance and Inspections:

- Report any unusual noises or malfunctions to maintenance immediately.

- Do not attempt to fix mechanical issues unless you are authorized and trained to do so. **Communication and Reporting:**

- Communicate any safety concerns to your supervisor or the safety team.
- Use the reporting system to report hazards and near-misses.



Safety is everyone's responsibility. By following these guidelines, you can help create a safer workplace for yourself and your colleagues.

Michigan Reconnect Program - Michigan Reconnect is a last-dollar scholarship program that pays for you to attend your in-district community college tuition-free or offers a large tuition discount if you attend an out-of-district community college.

GET YOUR DEGREE TUITION-FREE

To be eligible, you must:

- Be at least 25 years old when you apply
- Have lived in Michigan for a year or more
- Have a high school diploma, high school equivalency (GED), or certificate of completion
- Have not yet completed a college degree (associate or bachelor's)

If you do not have a high school diploma or equivalent, visit Michigan.gov/LearnMoreEarnMore to get started.

To participate in the Reconnect scholarship, you must complete four steps:

- <u>Apply online for Michigan Reconnect.</u> The application takes less than five minutes to complete and can be done on a mobile phone. If you are having difficulties on your mobile device, it is recommended to use a different browser or computer.
- <u>Apply to a Michigan public community college.</u> All public community colleges, including tribal colleges, in Michigan qualify. If you're already enrolled at a public community college this step is completed. If you're not, remember your tuition is free at an in-district community college, but that Reconnect only pays part of the tuition if you attend an out-of-district community college. See <u>What costs does Reconnect</u> <u>cover?</u>
- <u>Submit your FAFSA.</u> This is free financial aid provided by the federal government.
- Enroll in an eligible program and start classes. You can enroll in any Pell-eligible skill certificate or associate degree program.
